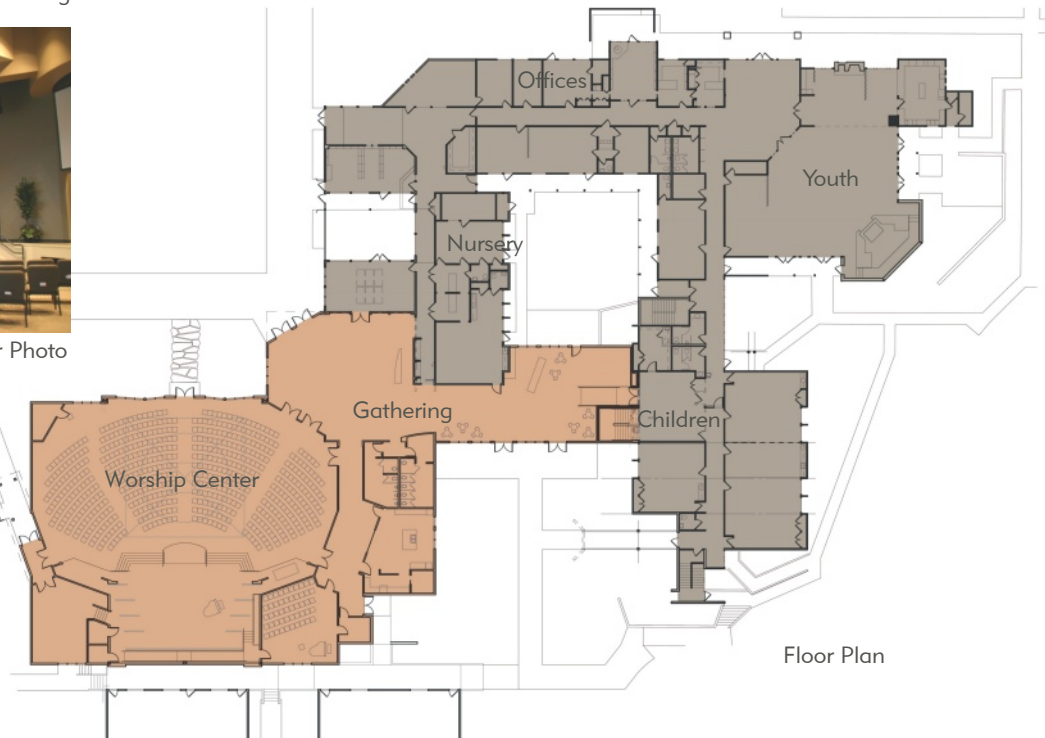

Because they lacked any stage, gathering space, or significant kitchen facility, the church had developed creative strategies for hosting events and community groups, but they needed to find a more permanent solution to accommodate the growing congregation.

So we developed a multiple-step master plan, and Phase One of construction was completed. Available space required locating the new, 11,000-square-foot, assembly area away from the street, but this also provided room for future expansion and a welcoming entry sequence. Support spaces, including a choir rehearsal room, set-building area, and a large kitchen, allow the new facility to operate independently from the classrooms and offices.

In order to avoid a costly sprinkler system retrofit throughout the existing building, the church opted to keep the new multi-purpose worship center detached until Phase Two. At that time, the old, U-shaped building will finally enclose an interior courtyard with a larger foyer and café. That foyer will provide more direct access to all uses, including several Phase Three additions.
